Chair Bruning called the meeting to order. Motion by Hemmer, seconded by Miles to approve the agenda. All voted "aye". Motion by Veldkamp, seconded by Hemmer to approve the following consent agenda with all voting "aye":

As advertised, the Board conducted the public hearing at 9:05 AM for the consideration of the Provisional Budget for 2022. The Board discussed changes to be made to the Budget. Auditor Krull will prepare the revised budget for the Board's review on September 21<sup>st</sup>.

As advertised a hearing was held for the Great Plains Indian Rodeo Liquor License. Motion by Miles, seconded by Hemmer to approve the Temporary Special Beer Permit and Temporary Special Permit for Consuming or Blending Alcoholic Beverages for the Great Plains Indian Rodeo, September 17-19, 2021. All voted "aye".

As advertised, the Board conducted the public hearing for The Moody County Five Year County Highway and Bridge Improvement Plan (Transportation Plan). Robert Anderson, Spring Creek Township, Melvin Kiecksee, Union Township and Wayne Holt and Gary DeClerk, Alliance Township were present. Open discussion was held with questions, concerns and input on the roads and bridges throughout the county including the bridges to be fixed in the next 5 years.

The  $2^{nd}$  reading was held for Ordinance No. 2021-02 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE 2020-02 OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF MOODY COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA, TO ESTABLISH AND REGULATE CANNABIS DISPENSARIES. Motion by Hemmer, seconded by Miles to adopt the following ordinance with all voting "aye":

ORDINANCE NO. 2021-02

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE 2020-02 OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF MOODY COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA, TO ESTABLISH AND REGULATE CANNABIS DISPENSARIES.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of Moody County, South Dakota: that CHAPTER 2.03 "DISTRICT REGULATIONS", SECTION 2.03.02 "Prohibited Uses" adopted by Ordinance 2020-02 on November 5, 2020, of the Zoning Ordinance of Moody County be amended by bolding and underline to read as follows:

#### Section 2.03.02. Prohibited Uses

All uses and structures not specifically listed as a permitted use or a conditional use in a particular zoning district shall be prohibited in said district.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of Moody County, South Dakota: that Chapter 2.05 "CI" COMMERCIAL/INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT, Section 2.05.02 "Permitted Use" adopted by Ordinance 2020-02 on November 5, 2020, of the Zoning Ordinance of Moody County be amended by adding language in bold and underline font as follows:

## 8. CANNABIS DISPENSARY (subject to Section 4.43)

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of Moody County, South Dakota: that ARTICLE IV "SUPPLEMENTAL REGULATIONS" adopted by Ordinance 2020-02 on November 5, 2020, of the Zoning Ordinance of Moody County be amended by adding language in bold and underline font as follows:

### **CHAPTER 4.43 CANNABIS DISPENSARIES.**

- 1. <u>Maximum Number of Cannabis Dispensaries.</u>
  - a. In the development and execution of these regulations, it is recognized that there are some uses which because of their very nature, are recognized as having serious objectionable operational characteristics, particularly when several of them are concentrated under certain circumstances thereby having a potential deleterious effect upon the adjacent areas. Special regulation of these uses is necessary to ensure that these adverse effects will not contribute to the blighting or downgrading of the surrounding neighborhood. The primary control or regulation is for the purpose of preventing a concentration of these uses in any one area.
  - b. The County shall allow up to three cannabis dispensaries provided the time, place, and manner of said dispensaries comply with this ordinance.
- 2. Required Separation Distances
  - a. A cannabis dispensary shall be located not less than 1,000 feet from a public or private school existing before the date of the cannabis dispensary application;
  - b. A cannabis dispensary shall be located not less than 1,000 feet from churches, residences, public parks, libraries, and other cannabis dispensaries existing before the date of the cannabis dispensary application;
  - c. <u>Exemption from separation requirements</u>. Any separation distance requirement, other than the <u>State requirement from schools (1,000 feet), may be waived, provided:</u>
    - i. <u>The applicant provides documentation waiving the setback requirement from the title holder of the land benefiting from the separation.</u>
  - d. <u>Prescribed separation/setback distances from certain existing uses are to be measured from the lot line of the property where the dispensary is proposed</u>
- 3. Other Locational Requirements
  - a. <u>Permanent or temporary dispensaries are prohibited in all other zoning districts and not eligible</u> for a home occupation use.
  - b. <u>It shall be unlawful to operate a dispensary in a building which contains a residence or a mixed-use building with commercial and residential uses.</u>
- 4. <u>Controlled Access No cannabis establishment shall share premises with or permit access directly from another medical cannabis establishment, business that sells alcohol or tobacco, or, if allowed by law, other cannabis establishment.</u>
- 5. Hours of operation:
  - a. Cannabis dispensaries are allowed to be open Monday through Saturday, excluding federally recognized holidays, between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M.
  - 6. **Documentation of State Licensure.** 
    - a. <u>No cannabis dispensary shall acquire, possess, store, deliver transfer, transport, supply or dispense cannabis, cannabis products, paraphernalia without providing documentation of licensure from the State of South Dakota.</u>
- 7. The zoning official is authorized to issue permits (building/use) for cannabis dispensaries subject to following:
  - a. Submission of a site plan containing the following:
    - i. Any information required for applicable building permit,
    - ii. Ingress and egress plan
    - iii. Parking plan
    - iv. Lighting plan (including security lighting)
    - v. <u>Screening/security fencing plan</u>,
    - vi. Refuse plan;
  - vii. Hours of Operation;
  - viii. Any other information as lawfully may be required by the Zoning official to determine compliance with this ordinance

- b. **Documentation of ability to meet setback/separation requirements.**
- c. **Documentation of State Licensure.**
- 8. All Cannabis Establishments are required to be constructed in conformance with the 2021 Edition of the International Building Code and International Fire Code.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of Moody County, South Dakota: that ARTICLE V "DEFINITIONS" adopted by Ordinance 2020-02 on November 5, 2020, of the Zoning Ordinance of Moody County be amended by adding language in bold and underline font as follows:

Cannabis (or Marijuana): all parts of any plant of the genus cannabis, whether growing or not, in its natural and unaltered state, except for drying or curing and crushing or crumbling. The term includes an altered state of marijuana absorbed into the human body. The term does not include fiber produced from the mature stalks of such plant, or oil or cake made from the seeds of such plant. The term does not include the plant Cannabis sativa L. (hemp) and any part of that plant, including the seeds thereof and all derivatives, extracts, cannabinoids, isomers, acids, salts, and salts of isomers, whether growing or not, with a delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol concentration of not more than three-tenths of one percent on a dry weight basis.

Cannabis Cultivation Facility: in addition to the definition in SDCL 34-20G-1, this term is further defined as a legally licensed entity that acquires, possesses, cultivates, delivers, transfers, transports, supplies, or sells cannabis and related supplies to a cannabis establishment.

Cannabis Dispensary: in addition to the definition in SDCL 34-20G-1, this term is further defined as a legally licensed entity that acquires, possesses, stores, delivers, transfers, transports, sells, supplies, or dispenses cannabis, cannabis products, paraphernalia, or related supplies and educational materials.

<u>Cannabis</u> <u>Establishment: a cannabis cultivation facility, a cannabis testing facility, a cannabis product manufacturing facility, or a cannabis dispensary.</u>

<u>Cannabis Product Manufacturing Facility: in addition to the definition in SDCL 34-20G-1, this term is further defined as a legally licensed entity that acquires, possesses, manufactures, delivers, transfers, transports, supplies, or sells cannabis products to a cannabis dispensary.</u>

<u>Cannabis Products: any concentrated cannabis, cannabis extracts, and products that are infused with cannabis or an extract thereof, and are intended for use or consumption by humans. The term includes edible cannabis products, beverages, topical products, ointments, oils, and tinctures.</u>

Cannabis Testing Facility: in addition to the definition in SDCL 34-20G-1, this term is further defined as a legally licensed entity legally authorized to analyze the safety and potency of cannabis.

Discussion was held on Ordinance 2021-03 An Ordinance Adding Chapter 4.43 to the Revised Ordinances of Moody County, South Dakota Creating Licensing Provisions for Cannabis Establishments.

Terry Albers, Emergency Manager met with the Board to discuss the Drainage Ordinance. Also present Rhonda Nelson, NRCS and Kris Grootwassink, Register of Deeds.

Albers discussed with the SLA agreement with the Board. Motion by Veldkamp, seconded by Miles to opt out of the SLA agreement. All voted "aye".

DeAnna Berke, Director of Equalization met with the Board to discuss Ag Exemption. Motion by Veldkamp to remove the 35% Ag Exemption. Motion died due to lack of a second.

Tawny Heinemann, Commission Assistant discussed staffing with the Board. Motion by Miles, seconded by Hemmer to accept the resignation of Anthony Gengler, Ambulance Director, effective September 26, 2021. All voted "aye". Motion by Hemmer, seconded by Veldkamp to advertise for the open Ambulance Director position. All voted "aye". Motion by Hemmer, seconded by Veldkamp to set Emergency Management/VSO position to match the Ambulance Director and Commission Assistant Grades in the pay scale. All voted "aye". Motion by Miles, seconded by Schiefelbein to advertise for an Emergency Manager/VSO. All voted "aye".

Heinemann presented a purchase request to the Board. Motion by Schiefelbein, seconded by Miles to authorize Chair Bruning to sign the service order with Vast. All voted "aye".

Heinemann discussed the Rural Access Infrastructure Program with the Board.
